The combined on-time performance average for MAY 2019 FY 2019 was 72%.

New Castle County Fixed Route was 69% New Castle County Contract Services was 82% Kent County Fixed Route was 78%. Sussex County Contract Services was 76%. Septa was 66% Resorts was 81%

I-95 Road Expansion/Process and challenges of installing new/improving bus stops- Stephen Ottinger, Planning

2 year project starting date November 2020. Brandywine River Bridge and city line all the way to 495 split. DelDOT plans to repair under structure of bridges and take care of all the rust. Ramps will be closed North bound first than South bound. There will be one lane North and South bound at some point in the project. 30% of the traffic will be reduced and traffic will be diverted through town. The plan is to dedicate bus lanes for Fixed Route bus services on Rt 13. This would allow the buses to get through faster than cars. The detours will last the full 2 years of the project.

Paratransit will be navigating on the fly. They will figure out what's best for the customers to ensure they can get where they need to get on time.

Improving Bus Stops:

Stops with low ridership will be eliminated and stops that are to close will also be looked at {750ft}. Stops need to be brought up to ADA Compliance. Stops with low ridership will not be improved. It cost up to \$100,000 to 200,000 for concreate to bring a stop up to compliance. Walkways would also need to be improved. Planning looks into request for bus stops. Some of the things they look at are

Safety requirements, ADA Compliance and Rider usage. They also look to ensure Tittle VI compliance for low income and minorities.

New Electric Buses- Paul Kulesza, Fixed Route Director

There will be a total of 16 electric buses. At this time Dover is running one of the six buses they have on Route 120. Due to the buses being 35 footers there will need to be some adjustments to routes. Was looking at placing one on Route 106 but there are changes being made on the base with jersey barriers that may prevent the bus from being put on that route. DTC will need to look at having in line chargers for the electric buses at the Hub. The cost of the chargers is close to a million.

Updates from DTC:

• Planning- Stephen Ottinger

Planning will be having Community Conversations in New Castle and Kent County. During Public Hearing individuals indicated they thought DTC had already made decisions about service changes.
